
CEO'S MESSAGE

Conversation With is an informal Q&A session with colleagues from various divisions.

In this issue, we sat down and talked to members of the ABME team on the importance of collaborating with TBEC, working with other entities in the group, as well as their most memorable projects.

Share with us how ABME has been supporting TBEC in the various projects?

Lau: As the Project Manager, I need to take charge of several areas, from operations to design, to ensure that work is done, and all projects are completed smoothly.

YK: My role as a Design Engineer is to prepare shop drawing submissions to the main

contractor (TBEC). As such, I have to raise RFI and liaise with them when there are design issues or discrepancies in architectural drawings and CS drawings. Other than that, we also act as an extra pair of eyes to go through the drawings.

Xiao: I am in charge of production, where experience and knowledge are must-have qualities. Quality is taken very seriously by TBEC, meeting

and exceeding the needs of customers and clients is of utmost importance.

Lau: To add on, as one of the units under SSS, it's key that we work closely with TBEC, and support them in various areas, such as providing quotations, work on-site, etc.

Collaboration is very important - we work together, benefit together, and succeed together. For the Parc Riviera project, ABME has worked closely with IPS. Tell us more about the project and some of the key challenges faced.

Lau: When the project first started, we supplied the metal decking, and came in as the fabricator based on that design. There was a minor issue with leakage, but most importantly, we solved the problem.

As this was something new to us, it was a good learning experience for us in terms of design and worksmanship – and we'll continue to improve.

YK: Coordination with IPS was important; we had to send them shop drawings to ensure the accuracy of the dimensions. With the design inputs from IPS, we revised some of the details to facilitate the fabrication. and managed to improve productivity.

Lau: All in all, we have a common goal to ensure no hiccups arise for external projects.

ABME was successfully awarded its first civil engineering project, which also happened to be ABME's first foray into the segment. Tell us more about that.

Lau: We came in as a fabricator, and supplied the temporary frame and transport frame for this project. LTA placed a strong emphasis on safety compliance, but given TBEC's consistently strong focus on safety, this was not an issue for us at all.

With this first project, we hope there will be more to come, not just in the capacity of a fabricator, but as installers too!

YK: These frames act as the soil stability system for this project and each is 15 metres long and 9 metres wide. Hence,



for transportation, we had to divide the frame into several parts. As for the drawing part, it's key that we work closely with our sub-con to ensure that the connection details in the drawing are applicable to the actual site installation.

Which has been your most memorable project till date?

Lau: From the HIP projects to the current ICPH, every project that I was involved in is memorable, as well as a challenge in itself! If I try to mention one, I don't think I can mention any – this is also to be fair to all the project teams and people I've worked with. So far, all has been great!

YK: As I only joined the team in 2015, the Brownstone was my most memorable project, because we managed to achieve so much while working on a really tight timeline!

Time to chat about something else other than projects and challenges! What are you really like outside of work?

YK: I enjoy times of tranquility and peace. I'll listen to music and indulge in computer games to relieve stress.

Lau: For me, outside of work, I think everyone should understand – as a family man, there's no rest day. Even after work, I need to do housework at home, so it's work outside of work. (*laughs*) Also, I have 3 kids, so I'll need to spend time guiding them, and studying with them.

But I'm also an avid lover of sports, so when there's time, I will go for a short swimming or running session. Recently, my kids have been asking me to train with them for their basketball competitions, which is not easy when you've reached a certain age! But I see these moments as bonding time with them, and that's mostly what I do outside of work.

Xiao: For me, work is priority, and

that has always been the case!

What are the top three things on your bucket list?

YK: Walk the Great Wall of China, fly in a private jet, and learn to cook!

Lau: I would want to become a successful businessman, do more charity work, and travel around the world with my family!

Bernard: I've nothing on the list, I'm contented to be happy everyday! Just like Xiao, I've only been focusing on work.

ABME has improved over the past two, three years, from moving into new markets to differentiating ourselves from existing competition. The teams have also improved in their communication, focusing more on customer-oriented service. Service comes first, for them.

As for working and collaborating with other entities, though there may be conflicts and disagreements at times, these situations actually strengthen the working relationship, and bring about greater understanding, as well as creativity!

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF ALEX TAN

ASSISTANT MANAGER (SPAZIO)

Collaboration is key, or so goes the old saying. Everything is made more efficient with more brains and more hands at work.

In the case of SPAZIO, the statement certainly rings true. As the bridge between the main cons and workers, having good coordination is no longer just a key; rather, it's the strong glue that holds everything together.

With the team's focus in both the Home Improvement Programme (HIP), and Builtto-Order (BTO) projects, having a strong channel of communication is a definite must.

"We need to coordinate very well with the various parties, including other main cons, not just within SPAZIO, and other TBEC entities," shares Alex Tan, Assistant Manager of SPAZIO.

Having worked his way up from rank and file and a former Project Coordinator himself, he draws upon his past experiences to deal with residents, especially the difficult ones.

His affable brand of charm kicks in after a mere hour or two, where he carries out a smooth negotiation of terms

with a fellow homeowner. The exchange is all smiles, and ends off on a positive note; Alex lets out a grateful smile.

Following that, he conducts a quick quality check on-site to ensure everything is in order. His phone rings, and after a few lines, he's headed off to another location.

Despite the rush, Alex considers the day to be "kind of slow", and brings up the memory of having a couple of hundred





hours' worth of calls in his days as a coordinator.

"Insanely hectic" would be an apt way of describing his work schedule then.

Since taking up the role of an Assistant Manager, he has taken on greater responsibility, supervising all projects that fall under SPAZIO's responsibility.

He trusts his small group of coordinators, and have them look after the finer details of a project. When bigger issues crop up, however, that's where he steps in. Citing the example of how the main con would sometimes decide to increase the number of units, the onus will fall on him to come up with a compromise for the new arrangement.

Other times will see him discussing the more serious and pressing issues of a project, or dealing with more difficult residents, which at this stage, should already be something the team expects.

And no, the number of phone calls he receives while on the job has yet to dwindle.

In fact, his phone is connected to a power bank as he makes his way to the next site location. He points to it, and laughingly says that he always has portable chargers on stand-by.

Little time is wasted along the journey. Alex dishes out instructions and suggestions on the ball, and it turns out running around Singapore is also part of the job scope.

It's a lot of legwork, so days where everything runs smoothly are greatly welcomed. That's



when Alex and his coordinators can take a breather, and use the time to clear their paperwork, or conduct surprise site visits.

To complement their HIP projects for older HDB estates, SPAZIO comes armed with a six-item package deal: timber doors, metal gates, grab bars, rubbish chutes, toilet doors, aluminium bi-fold doors, and louvre windows.

Other products that SPAZIO supply include PVC doors, flooring, PVC skirting, and grab bars, amongst others.

With a wide product portfolio, and coupled with the increased responsibilities that Alex now has, collaboration is key to ensure the smooth operations of projects under his charge. A lot of effort would have to be put in the process of:

- Liaising and coordinating contractors and workers
- Ensuring early orders and timely arrival of materials working closely with the QS, procurement and warehouse team

So yes, a substantial amount of labour is required. The hard work pays off, though, when residents appreciate the effort and and compliment the team on a job well done. While praise hardly gets filtered to the sub-con level, individuals are sometimes kept informed of it through the main con, which is the greatest sense

of satisfaction one can get for their service.

As Alex steps into the new site, a hive of activity fills the air. Workers walk around with doors lifted upon their shoulders; some are kneeling down, in the midst of an installation process.

It's all work and no play, and the no-nonsense attitude is understandable, considering how each HIP unit runs on the tight timeline of 10 days.

While doing a round of mandatory quality check, he saw one of his workers outside a unit who appears to be having a disagreement with the resident.

With calm, steady steps, he approaches her, sporting a friendly smile on his face. Surprisingly, her face lit up when she saw him, and it turned out that the supposed "disagreement" was actually a miscommunication between both parties due to the language barrier.

After resolving the issues raised by the female resident, Alex lets out a tired yet satisfied smile it's all in a day's work for him, and the lingering sense of respect is all but rightly deserved.




